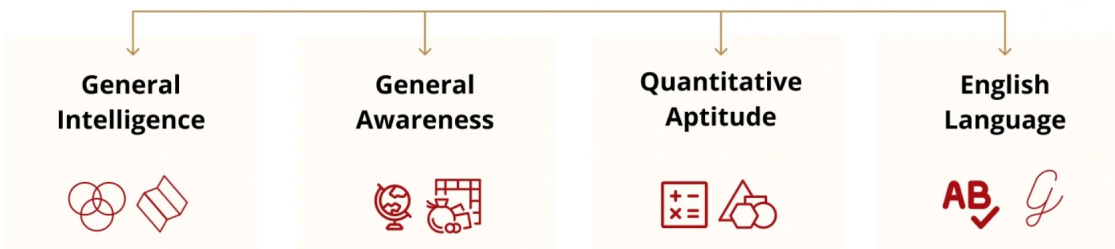


SSC CHSL SYLLABUS

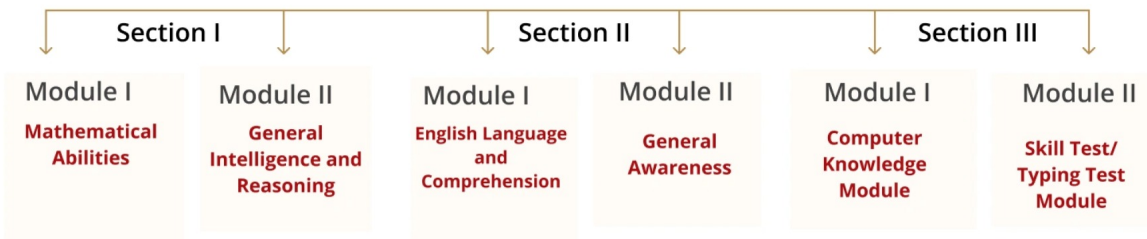

Tier 2 exam has been divided into two separate sessions: Session I and Session II, both held on the same day. It's important to note that Session I will include Section I: Module I and II, Section II: Module I and II, and Section III: Module I. Meanwhile, Session II will focus on Section III: Module II. Additionally, this tier incorporates a penalty of 1 mark for each incorrect answer, applicable only in Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III.

The SSC CHSL Computer Based examination is divided into two tiers: Tier 1 and Tier 2.

Tier 1 consists of 100 objective-type, multiple-choice questions, with a maximum score of 200 marks. There is a penalty of 0.50 marks for each incorrect answer, making accuracy essential for maximizing your score.

Tier 2 of the SSC CHSL exam will be conducted in two sessions on the same day. Session I will include Section I, Section II, and Module I of Section III, while Session II will cover Module II of Section III. Except for Module II of Section III, Tier 2 will feature objective-type, multiple-choice questions. The questions will be available in English, Hindi, and any other language you selected during the application process.

SSC Syllabus for CHSL - Subject Wise Topic Weightage

As you're aware, the SSC syllabus for CHSL exam comprises two tiers, both featuring objective-type multiple-choice questions. Here are the details:

- For Tier 1, each correct answer earns you 2 marks, with a penalty of 0.50 marks for every incorrect response.
- In Tier 2, correct answers fetch 3 marks, but an incorrect response deducts 1 mark. This deduction applies only to Section 1, Section 2, and Module 1 of Section 3.

Additionally, we'll now introduce you to the marks normalization formula utilized by SSC.

SSC Syllabus for CHSL - Marks Normalization

Let's start by delving into the concept of normalization. Normalization is a statistical method aimed at considering the variations in the difficulty levels of question papers across different shifts of the same examination. Comparing scores directly may not be justifiable due to potential differences in the complexity of questions across shifts. To ensure a fairer evaluation of candidates, normalization tackles this issue by equalizing the scores.

Hence, SSC has introduced a formula, as detailed in

These standardized scores will be used to establish the cut-off marks, ultimately contributing to the creation of the merit list.

The notification for SSC CHSL in 2024 was revealed on 8th April 2024. Nonetheless, according to the SSC's tentative calendar, the notification was anticipated to be out on 2nd April 2024.
