Comprehension On Puzzle Questions

Direction: Read the given information carefully and answer the following questions. In a building of seven floors such that the ground floor is numbered as 1 and the topmost floor is numbered as 7, seven persons are living on them. All of them are of different ages - 26 years, 64 years, 36 years, 39 years, 45 years, 16 years, and 71 years. The age of the person who lives on floor number 3 is a square of multiple of four. The oldest person among them lives on an odd number floor above floor number 4. The person whose age is 16 years lives just above the person whose age is 45 years. The age of the person who lives on floor number 1 is a multiple of 13 but not a multiple of 2. Three persons live below the person whose age is 64 years. The person whose age is square of 6 lives on a floor above the oldest person but not immediately above.

Question On Puzzle

What is the difference between the ages of persons living on floors 3 and 4?

Puzzle Questions Solution

The correct answer is **Option 3** i.e. **48 years**



Decoding the puzzle	Corresponding Inferences																
<p>1) First, we place all definite information in the table, Three persons live below the person whose age is 64 years.</p> <p>2) The age of the person who lives on floor number 3 is a square of multiple of four. 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4) The age of the person who lives on floor number 1 is a multiple of 13 but not a multiple of 2. (This means that age of that person is 39 years.)

5) The oldest person among them lives on an odd number floor above floor number 4.

6) The person whose age is square of 6 lives on a floor above the oldest person but not immediately above.

(From statements 5 and 6, we can deduce that the age of the person living on floor number 5 is 71 years and the age of the person living on the top floor is 36 years.)

7) The person whose age is 26 years live on floor number 6.

Now we have our final arrangements.

Clearly, the result will be $(64 - 16)$ years = 48 years.

Floors	Ages
7	36 years
6	26 years
5	71 years
4	64 years
3	16 years
2	45 years
1	39 years

Hence, the correct answer is **48 years.**
