

#### Solution:

The correct answer is option 3 i.e. 15: 18: 11.

Income ratio = 12x: 9x: 7x

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Expenditure ratio = 15y: 9y: 8y

Savings ratio = (12x - 15y): (9x - 9y): (7x - 8y)

According to the question;

Aswath saves 25% of his income.

So, (12x - 15y) = 25% of 12x

12x - 15y = 3x

9x = 15y

x/y = 15/9

Thus, x = 15, y = 9

Saving of Aswath =  $(12x - 15y) = (12 \times 15 - 15 \times 9) = (180 - 135) = 45$ 

Saving of Sunita =  $(9x - 9y) = (9 \times 15 - 9 \times 9) = (135 - 81) = 54$ 

Saving of Ramdin =  $(7x - 8y) = (7 \times 15 - 8 \times 9) = (105 - 72) = 33$ 

Ratio of savings of Aswath: Sunita: Ramdin = 45: 54: 33 = 15: 18: 11

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

- II. Some mangoes are plums False (It is possible, but no definite conclusion can be drawn).
- III. All lemons are dates **True** (As all lemons are plums, all plums are dates, so, all lemons are dates).
- IV. Some mangoes are dates **True** (As some dates are mangoes, so, some mangoes are also dates).

Hence, Both conclusions III and IV follow.


