Solution:

The correct answer is option 3 i.e. The lesson is being explained by the teacher.

- In the active voice sentence "The teacher is explaining the lesson," the subject (teacher) is performing the action (explaining).
- In the passive voice, the object of the active sentence (lesson) becomes the subject.
- The verb changes to its passive form ("is being explained"), and "by the teacher" indicates who is performing the
 action.

Question 2:

Some words in the following sentence have been underlined and given as options. Select the option that contains a spelling error. He is an audacious entrepreneur who started his own business with the bear minimum.

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 65 Seconds

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Options:

- 1. business
- 2. audacious
- 3. entrepreneur

Solution:

The correct answer is option 4 i.e. bear.

The correct phrase is "bare minimum," which means the absolute minimum necessary.

"Bear" refers to the animal, whereas "bare" means minimal or scanty.

Therefore, the correct spelling should be "bare minimum," not "bear minimum."

Question 3:

Sentences with spelling errors are given. Select the sentence with NO error.

Difficulty : Moderate Average Time : 46 Seconds

Options:

- 1. The body produces more saliva under fluorescent illumination which helps prevent cavities.
- 2. The body produces more saliva under fluorescent illummination which helps prevent cavaties.
- 3. The body produces more saliva under fluorescent illummination which helps prewent cavities.

Solution:

The correct answer is **option 1** i.e. **The body produces more saliva under fluorescent illumination which helps prevent cavities.**

The word "illumination" is correctly spelled as "illumination."

"Cavities" and "prevent" are also correctly spelled in this sentence.

The other options contain spelling errors:

"Illummination" (option 2 and 3) and "prewent" (option 3 and 4) are misspelled words.

Therefore, the correct sentence with no spelling errors is the first option provided.

Question 4:

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 70 Seconds

Options:

Solution:

- The phrase "tip of the iceberg" is an idiomatic expression that means a small, visible part of a larger problem or issue that is not immediately apparent.
- In the context of the sentence, it suggests that the presence of termites (the visible problem) is indicative of a much larger issue (the house near collapsing).

Solution:

The correct answer is **option 4** i.e. **a.**

- "Mahabharata" is a singular noun referring to the ancient Indian epic.
- When referring to a specific work or title like "Mahabharata," we do not use the indefinite article "a."
- Therefore, it should be "from the Mahabharata," indicating stories from the specific epic.

Question 6:

Difficulty : Moderate	Average Time : 50 Seconds					

Options:

Solution:

The correct answer is option 4 i.e. Increase.

- The sentence suggests that an increase in population is seen as a hindrance to a country's growth.
- "Increase" here means a rise or growth in population, which can pose challenges such as strain on resources, infrastructure, and economic development.

Question 7:


Selective: This means showing careful consideration or discrimination in choosing or deciding.



A: This sentence explains one of the benefits of nostalgia, which is its ability to help people maintain a positive psychological state, especially during challenging times.

C: It concludes the paragraph by discussing the adaptive functions of nostalgia, emphasizing its role in providing emotional relief and other positive effects, such as pain relief.

Therefore, "delicate" is the synonym that best matches the meaning of "fragile."

- The correct form for expressing an action that started in the past and continues up to a point in the future is the future perfect progressive tense, formed as "will have been working."
- Therefore, the corrected sentence should be: "In 2023, she will have been working in the company for three vears."
