Solution:

The correct answer is option 3 i.e. Fifty-one cakes have to be baked by Sanyukta for the anniversary party.

- **Subject:** "Fifty-one cakes" (new subject in passive voice).
- Verb: "have to be baked" (passive form of "has to bake" indicating obligation).
- Agent: "by Sanyukta" indicates who performs the action in passive voice.
- Additional information: "for the anniversary party" specifies the purpose or context.

Question 3:

Difficulty: Moderate

Solution:

Therefore, **assent** is the correct antonym here, as it denotes agreement rather than disagreement.


Digestible means able to be digested or understood.

Sentence D: It provides a personal example or consequence of the points made in Sentences B and A. Max, due to the busy and less pedestrian-friendly nature of London, does not engage in walking activities.

Sentence C: Finally, Sentence C contrasts the urban environment described in Sentences B and A with life in the countryside. It highlights that in contrast to London, where walking is less common, in the countryside, walking is more relaxed and enjoyable, except in adverse weather conditions.

- The verb changes to its passive form ("is being read"), and "by my father" indicates who is performing the action.

- Therefore, the error is in the option where "were" is used incorrectly with a singular subject.




