#### Solution:

The correct answer is option 3 i.e. may be converted.

- "May be" is used to express possibility or permission, while "can be" expresses capability or certainty.
- Transform means making a marked change in the form, nature, or appearance of something.
- Among the given options, **Convert** is appropriate.
- Convert means changing the form, character, or function of something.
- · Meaning of the other words:
  - Evolved refers to the gradual development or change over time.
  - Devaluing something or someone means considering them less valuable or important.

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#### Question 2:

Select the most appropriate synonym of the underlined word. #### Solution:

The correct answer is option 3 i.e. insight.

**Wisdom** means the quality of having experience, knowledge, and good judgment; the quality of being wise.

Insight means the capacity to gain an accurate and deep understanding of someone or something.

Meaning of the other words:

Folly: lack of good sense; foolishness.

Emotion: a strong feeling deriving from one's circumstances, mood, or relationships with others.

#### Question 3:

Select the option that expresses the given sentence in active voice. The deer was killed by the boar.

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 53 Seconds

#### Options:

- 1. The deer killed the boar.
- 2. The boar was killing the deer.

Solution:

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The correct answer is option 4 i.e. The boar killed the deer.

- Sentence structure of voice in the simple past tense.
  - o Active: Subject + V2 + Object
  - Passive: Object + was/were + V3 + by + Subject
- Following this structure the sentence in the passive voice will be: The boar killed the deer.

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Select the most appropriate option to fill in the blank. She could easily eat the \_\_\_\_\_ biryani by herself.

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 54 Seconds

Options:

1. haul

2. whole

3. hall

4. hole

Solution:

The correct answer is option 2 i.e. whole.

Whole means all of; entire.

Example: he spent the whole day walking

The sentence refers to the total portion of the Biriyani.

Meaning of the other words:

**Haul** refers to the act of pulling, dragging, or transporting something with considerable effort or force.

A hall is a passageway or a large room within a building.

A hole refers to a hollow space or opening in an object.

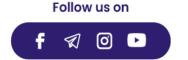
Question 5:

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 58 Seconds

Options:

#### Solution:

The correct answer is **option 3** i.e. **Hangar.** 

A **hangar** is a large shed or indoor area used to shelter or store aircraft, such as airplanes or helicopters. It provides protection from the elements and serves as a maintenance and storage facility for aerial vehicles.

Meaning of the other words:

A **hanger** is a device used to suspend or hang something, typically tubular in shape and made of plastic, wood, or wire material. It can come in various shapes and sizes depending on the needs of the user.

A **scullery** refers to a small room or area in a house, traditionally located near the kitchen, where dishes are washed, food is prepared, and other household chores related to cleaning and food storage take place.

An aviary is an enclosure or large cage specifically designed to house birds, especially exotic or rare species.

#### Question 6:

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 75 Seconds

#### Options:

### Solution:

The correct answer is option 4 i.e. get extreme cold.

- Option 4 has the grammatically incorrect part.
- "Cold" is an adjective so we need an **adverb** to modify it but "extreme" is also an *adjective*, hence wrong.
- The correct adverb to use here is "extremely".

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The correct sentence will be "It can get extremely cold during the winter".

#### Question 7:

Select the INCORRECTLY spelt word.

Difficulty : Moderate Average Time : 50 Seconds

#### Options:

- 1. Dearth
- 2. Acceptible
- 3. Corrupt
- 4. Barely

#### Solution:

The correct answer is option 2 i.e. Acceptible.

Acceptible is the incorrectly spelt word.

The correct spelling is Acceptable.

It means able to be agreed on; suitable.

Example: The electoral arrangements must be acceptable to the people.

#### Question 8:

Select the INCORRECTLY spelt word.

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 40 Seconds

#### Options:

- 2. Syrup

#### Solution:

The correct answer is **option 1** i.e. **Sufficeint.** 

Sufficeint incorrectly spelt word.

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The correct spelling is **Sufficient**.

It means enough; adequate.

Example: They had sufficient resources to survive.

#### Question 9:

Select the most appropriate ANTONYM of the underlined word. My niece is an amateur artist. I hope she becomes famous one day.

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 43 Seconds

#### Options:

#### Solution:

The correct answer is option 3 i.e. Expert.

Amateur: a person who engages in a pursuit, especially a sport, on an unpaid rather than a professional basis.

Expert: a person who is very knowledgeable about or skillful in a particular area.

Other words are self-explanatory and contextually incorrect.

#### Question 10:

Select the most appropriate option to substitute the underlined segment in the given sentence. The secretary to my boss is very efficient as he not only gives him the required information and also handles correspondence independently.

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 49 Seconds

#### Options:

- 1. yet also handles
- 2. but also handles

- 4. not also handles

Solution:

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The correct answer isoption 2 i.e. but also handles.

- "Not only" is generally followed by "but also".
  - o Example: He is not only kind but also brave.
- Hence, option 2 is the correct substitute. Other options are wrong because they do not have "but".

#### Question 11:

Sentences of a paragraph are given below in jumbled order. Arrange the sentences in the correct order to form a meaningful and coherent paragraph. A. My grandmother always went to school with me because the school was attached to the temple. B. When we both finished, we would be back together. C. While the children sat in rows on either side of the verandah singing the alphabet or prayer in chorus, my grandmother sat inside reading the scriptures. D. The priest taught us the alphabet and the morning prayer.

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 68 Seconds

#### Options:

#### Solution:

The correct answer is option 3 i.e. ADCB.

Sentence A is the opening line as it is an independent sentence.

Sentence D talks about "alphabet and morning prayer" and Sentence C again refers to the same. So, DC is a mandatory pair.

B is the last sentence as it closes the flow of events.

Option 3 has the correct sequence.

#### Question 12:

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 51 Seconds

Cloud burst means a sudden heavy fall of rain.

Rainstorm means a storm with heavy rain.

Meaning of the other words:

A sandstorm is a strong wind in a desert area that carries sand through the air.

Famine refers to a severe shortage of food in a specific region or population. It results in widespread hunger, malnutrition, and sometimes even starvation.

Snowfall occurs when snow descends from the atmosphere and accumulates on the ground.

#### Question 13:

  - Co-writers are individuals who collaborate on writing projects together.

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Colleagues refer to people you work with, especially in a professional job.

o Associates are individuals connected to you or your organization in a professional capacity.

**Example:** Dad got up on the wrong side of the bed, and he's been grumpy all day.

Birds of a feather: people who share similar interests, characteristics, or backgrounds tend to associate with each other.

**Bird brain:** someone who is perceived as not very intelligent or forgetful.

Option 2 has the correct sequence.



  - o Passive: Object + am/is/are + being + V3 + by + Subject
- Following this structure the sentence in the passive voice will be: The charity function is being organised tomorrow.

C is the first in the sequence as it introduces the topic "William Shakespeare".

Other options do not have C in the initial position, so they are obviously incorrect.

Meaning of the other words are:

Jaded: feeling exhausted or worn out due to overwork or excessive experiences.

Corrupt: dishonest, immoral, or tainted by unethical practices.

Convinced: firmly believing or being persuaded of something.

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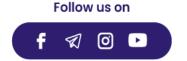

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
