

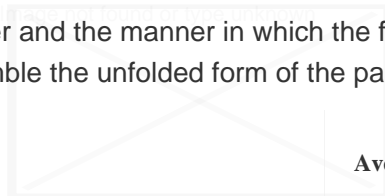

Solution :

The correct answer is **option 1** i.e. **conduct**.

The word "**conduct**" means to carry out or perform a research, or investigation.

In the sentence, the committee is tasked with performing a survey on government schemes, so "conduct" conveys the idea of organizing and executing the survey.

The other options, such as "fight," "hold," and "originate," do not convey the appropriate meaning in this context.

Hence, the correct answer should be "**conduct**."

Question 3 :

Select the option that expresses the given sentence in indirect speech. She said impatiently, "I don't need any help."

Difficulty : Moderate

Solution :

The correct answer is **option 2** i.e. **She said impatiently that she didn't need any help**.

"I" is changed to "she."

The tense of the reported speech is changed. In the given sentence, "don't" is changed to "didn't" to shift from the present tense to the past tense.

Question 4 :

Select the option that can be used as a one-word substitute for the given group of words. An arched structure in a garden having climbing plants

Difficulty : Difficult

Solution :

The correct answer is **option 2** i.e. **Pergola**.

A pergola is a garden structure with an open frame that offers shade and looks nice. It's often covered in climbing plants.

Question 5 :

- To change the sentence to active voice, we move "him" to the subject position and "a new invention" to the object position, resulting in "He has made a new invention."

R = 1, E = 2, A = 3, C = 4, T = 5, I = 6, V = 7, E = 8

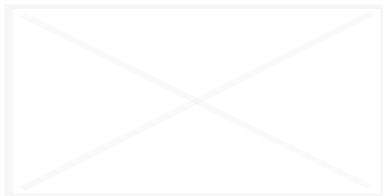
Option 1: 4, 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 7, 6

CREATEVI - This is not a meaningful word.

Option 2: 4, 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8

CREATIVE - This is a meaningful word.

Hence, **option 2** is the correct answer.

Each letter + 2;

Then, reverse the code.

SLAIN = UNCKP

$S + 2 = U$

$L + 2 = N$

$A + 2 = C$

$I + 2 = K$

$N + 2 = P$

'DENT' is written as 'VPGF'

DENT = FGPN

$D + 2 = F$

$E + 2 = G$

$N + 2 = P$

$T + 2 = V$

Similarly;

Code for the word CUBOID:

$C + 2 = E$

$U + 2 = W$

$B + 2 = D$

$O + 2 = Q$

$I + 2 = K$

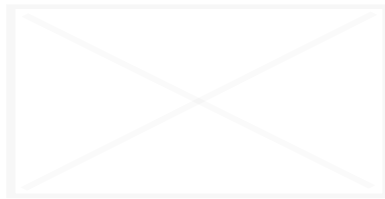
$D + 2 = F$

CUBOID = FKQDWE

Hence, **FKQDWE** is the correct answer.

Question 8 :

The correct answer is **option 2** i.e. **7: 15: 49**.

The logic used here is:

Option 1: 11: 21: 121

$$11 \times 2 = 22$$

$$22 - 1 = 21$$

$$11^2 = 121$$

This follows the logic.

Option 2: 7: 15: 49

$$7 \times 2 = 14$$

$$14 - 1 = 13$$

$$7^2 = 49$$

This does not follow the logic.

Hence, **option 2** is the odd one out.

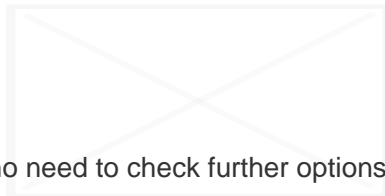

$$= 11 + 7 \times 69 \cdot 31$$

$$= 11 + 483 \cdot 31$$

$$= 463 \text{ is not equal to } 115.$$

As we have found our answer, there is no need to check further options.



Option 2: $\times, +, \div,$

After interchanging the expression becomes:

$$= 11 \times 7 + 345 \div 5 \cdot 31 = 115$$

$$= 11 \times 7 + 69 \cdot 31$$

$$= 77 + 69 \cdot 31$$

$$= 115 \text{ is equal to } 115.$$

As we have found our answer, there is no need to check further options.

Hence, **option 2** is the correct answer.

Question 10 :

Question 11 :

One of the statements may be the effect of the other statement. Read both statements and select the correct answer. I. Over the last two years 22% of Company P's manpower was laid off. II. I. Over the last two years 22% of Company P's manpower was laid off.

II. Over the past two years Company P has sold off many of their major assets.

From both statements, it is clear that the company might have faced a loss, so, it would have decided to lay off some employees and sell off major assets to prevent the company from being shut down. We can say that both are the effects of

a common cause.

(I) K sits to the immediate right of P. Only two people sit between P and Q. R sits second to the right of M.

According to the question, the arrangement is as follows:


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From the above arrangement, R sits second to the left of P.

(II) Only two people sit between N and M. Q is an immediate neighbour of M. Only one person sits between Q and K.

According to the question, the arrangement is as follows:

From the above arrangement, we cannot find who is second to the left of P.

Hence, **Data in statement I alone is sufficient to answer the question while data in statement II is not.**

Question 14 :

The correct answer is **option 1** i.e. **Only Conclusion III follows.**

The least possible Venn Diagram for the given statements is drawn below:

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Conclusions:

- I. Some Bangles are Rings **False** (It is possible, but no definite conclusion can be drawn.)
- II. Some Chains are Bangles **False** (It is possible, but no definite conclusion can be drawn.)
- III. Some Rings are Bracelets **True** (As some bracelets are chains and all chains are rings, so, some rings are bracelets is also true.)

Hence, **Only conclusion III follows.**

Question 15 :

Amit ranked 7th from the top and 26th from the bottom in his class. How many students are there in the class?

Difficulty : Moderate

Solution :

The correct answer is **option 4** i.e. **32.**

Number of students in the class = Position of person from top + Position of person from bottom - 1 = 26 + 7 - 1 = 32

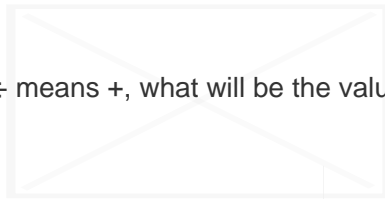

As the statement says some serious mistakes were found in the technical section, so to check that one team should be appointed, so that no errors will be faced later. Hence, this is a possible course of action

II. A reason explanation notice should be issued to all the employees involved in the

irregularities.

As there is a technical glitch, so, there will be some irregularities, to prevent this proper notice should be issued. Hence, this is also a possible course of action.

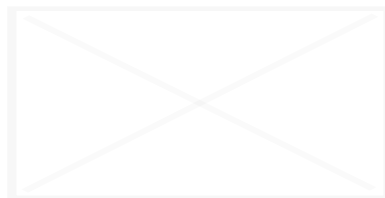

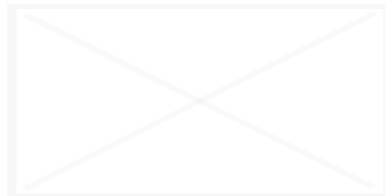

Hence, **option 3** is the correct answer.

Question 25 :

Difficulty : Moderate

I. R F: **False** ($R > G$ $Y > Q = F$ Opposite signs are present, so, there is no relation between R and F.)

II. R Z: **False** ($R = E = Z$ implies $R = Z$ and not $R > Z$.)

Hence, the correct answer is **Neither conclusion I nor II is true.**

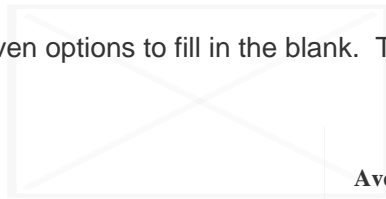

Therefore, **toe** is the correct answer.

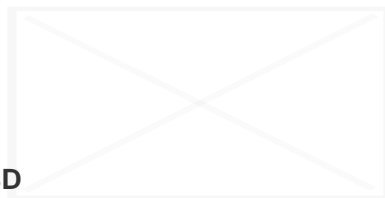

Sentence C provides additional information about the SDGs, referring to them as the Global Goals and emphasizing their aim to create an inclusive world.

Sentence B builds on this by highlighting the critical role of child rights in achieving the SDGs.

Sentence D connects all the previous statements by explaining how children worldwide are actively working to secure their rights in the context of the SDGs.

Hence, the correct order is **ACBD**.

Question 29 :

The tense is adjusted to "will" to represent the exact words that Harry would use if speaking directly.

Hence, the correct answer would be **option 2**.

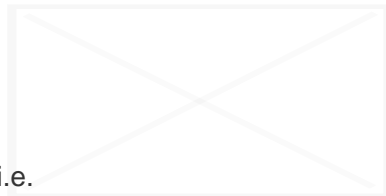
