

 sorrow, surprise, applause, detest, hate, etc." Reporting Verbs are changed according to the notion of Reported
 Speech. These verbs are 'exclaimed with surprise, exclaimed with sorrow, exclaimed with joy, exclaimed with
 contempt, etc.'
- In the reportig verb, 'said' will be used in place of 'prayed'.
- Comma and inverted commas will be removed. And conjunction 'to' will also be removed.
- 'O God!' will be added.

After following these steps, we got the direct speech as: The young man said, "O God! Help me clear this interview."

- \bullet In the given sentence, 'were + V_3 ' has been used, which implies that the active form should contain 'past participle'
- Now, simply exchange the places of the subject and the object. The subject should become the object and viceversa while changing a sentence from Active to Passive voice or reverse.
- Remove the word 'by' when converting into active form.
- As the sentence is an interrogative sentence, so the word 'who' will be used.

The active form will be: Who pushed you into the mud?

Hence, the correct answer is Option 2 i.e. Who pushed you into the mud?

- 'How' will be used as a conjunction because we know that if the reported speech is interrogative with question word

then the question word itself becomes the conjunction.

- 'You' will be changed into 'he'.
- In the reporting speech, present perfect continuous tense 'have been working' will be changed into past perfect continuous tense 'had been working'.
- 'This' will be changed into 'That'.

After following these steps, we got the indirect speech as: The supervisor asked the worker how long he had been working for that company.

Hence, the correct answer is **Option 2** i.e. **The supervisor asked the worker how long he had been working for that company.**

- Now, simply exchange the places of the subject and the object. The subject should become the object and viceversa while changing a sentence from Active to Passive voice or reverse.
- · Remove the word 'by' when converting into active form.
- Lastly, as "children" is a plural subject, therefore, 'have' will be used.

The active form will be: Many children have bought kites.

Hence, the correct answer is Option 1 i.e. Many children have bought kites.

- Inverted commas will get omitted and 'that' will be used.
- The reporting verb "Said to" will be changed into "told".
- In the reported speech, 'celebrated' will be changed into 'had celebrated'. (Simple past tense to Past perfect tense)
- The pronoun 'I' will be changed into 'he'.
- The pronoun 'my' will be changed into 'his'
- Lastly, 'two daays ago' will be changed into 'two days before'.

- Sentence B and sentence D, 'First' and 'Second' are cardinals (those that indicate order or sequence of happenings). Therefore, sentence B will be the next sentence and sentence D will follow it.
- Lastly, sentence A will be used because it makes a contrasting conclusion.

- In the reporting speech, change the past continuous tense form i.e. 'was going' into present continuous tense form i.e. 'do' and the past perfect tense i.e. 'had never attempted' into present perfect tense i.e. 'am going', when converting into direct speech.
- Next, the pronoun 'she' will be changed to pronoun 'I' in direct speech.

After following these steps, we got the direct speech as: She said to her brother, "I am going to meet my friend.

Hence, the correct answer is **Option 4** i.e. **She said to her brother, "I am going to meet my friend.**

Hence, the correct answer is Option 3 i.e. shouted out to each another.



- Thus, the correct order after rearrangement is **option 2** i.e. **BADC.**

- Imperative sentence: If someone gives a command, request, express a desire, or wish, in a sentence then such sentences are called Imperatives sentences.
- The structure of the given sentence will be Let + Sub + be + V₃. 'Let' will be added to start the sentence, as a
 passive form of a command.
- 'Hang' will be changed into past particple form i.e. 'hung'.

The passive form will be: Let the washing be hung on the clothesline.

Hence, the correct answer is **Option 1** i.e. **Let the washing be hung on the clothesline.**
