Solution:

The correct answer is **Option 3** i.e. **650.89**

Find the average

693, 456, 876, 532, 934, 691, 596, 398, 682

The average = [693 + 456 + 876 + 532 + 934 + 691 + 596 + 398 + 682]/9 = 5858/9 = 650.89

Question 2:

The largest three-digit number that gives the same remainder 2 when divided by 3, 5 and 9 is ______

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 36 Seconds

Options:

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999

Solution:

The correct answer is Option 4 i.e. 992

Given that

The largest three-digit number that gives the same remainder 2 when divided by 3, 5 and 9.

LCM(3, 5, 9) = 45

The largest three-digit number that gives the same remainder $2 = 45 \times 22 + 2 = 990 + 2 = 992$

Question 3:

The angle of elevation of the top of a tower from the top of a building whose height is 680 m is 45° and the angle of elevation of the top of same tower from the foot of the same building is 60°. What is the height (in m) of the tower?

Difficulty : Moderate Average Time : 51 Seconds

Options:

Solution:

The correct answer is option 1 i.e. 340(3 + 3)

Let AB be a building = 680 m

The CD is a tower

As shown in the figure

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












In triangle ACE

tan 45° = CE/BD

CE = BD = CD - 680

In triangle CBD

 $tan 60^{\circ} = CD/BD$

CD = BD 3

AB = CD - CE

CD = AB + CE = 680 (3 - 1)/3

CD = 340(3 + 3) m

Question 4:

The median of a set of 11 distinct observations is 73.2. If each of the largest five observations of the set is increased by 3, then the median of the new set:

Difficulty: Moderate

Average Time: 64 Seconds

Solution:

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The correct answer is Option 3 i.e. remains the same as that of the original set

Given that

The median of a set of 11 distinct observations is 73.2

The observation is 11 (odd number)

it means that the median in the 6th observation is 73.2

Now,

If each of the largest five observations of the set is increased by 3.

Then, the median will not change because the obervation is still 11 then the median is still the 6th observation i.e. 73.2

Thus, the median remains the same as that of the original set.

Question 5:

A prism and a pyramid have the same base and the same height. Find the ratio of the volumes of the prism and the pyramid.

The correct answer is Option 2 i.e. 3a ¶ 1

Given that

A prism and a pyramid have the same base and the same height.

As we know that

The volume of a prism = The area of the base of the prism \times height of the prism

and

The volume of a pyramid = $1/3 \times$ The area of the base of the pyramid × height of the pyramid

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Hence, the required ratio = 1/(1/3) = 3/1

= 3: 1

Question 6:

What is the volume of a cylinder if the radius of the cylinder is 10 cm and height is 20 cm? (Take = 3.14)

Formula used

The volume of a cylinder = $r^2 h$

 $= 3.14 \times 100 \times 20$

 $= 6280 \text{ cm}^3$

Question 7:

A goods train 350 m long passes through a tunnel of length 1250 m in 80 seconds. What is the speed of the train?

Difficulty : Moderate Average Time : 44 Seconds

Options:

Solution:

The correct answer is Option 4 i.e. 72 km/h

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As we know that

Speed = Distance/Time

Speed = $[(1250 + 350)/80] \times 18/5 \text{ km/h}$

=72 km/h

Question 8:

If the four-digit number 463y is divisible by 7, then what is the value of y?

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 39 Seconds

Solution:

The correct answer is Option 1 i.e. 4

Given that

If the four-digit number 463y is divisible by 7

Divisibility rule of 7

The difference between twice the unit digit of the given number and the remaining part of the given number should be a multiple of 7 or it should be equal to 0.

463 - 2y is a multiple of 7

y = 4 satisfies the equation the number is divided by 7

Hence, y = 4 is a required answer

Question 9:

PQRS is a cyclic quadrilateral. If P is three times of R and S is four times of Q, then the sum of S + R will be:

The correct answer is Option 4 i.e. 189°

GIvent that

PQRS is a cyclic quadrilateral. If P is three times of R and S is four times of Q,

As we know that

$$P + R = 180^{\circ}$$

$$3R + R = 180^{\circ}$$

$$R = 45^{\circ}$$

$$Q + S = 180^{\circ}$$

$$Q + 4 Q = 180^{\circ}$$

$$5 Q = 180^{\circ}$$

$$Q = 36^{\circ}$$

$$S = 4*36 = 144^{\circ}$$

As we know

$$S + R = 144^{\circ} + 45^{\circ} = 189^{\circ}$$

 $d = 6 \times 10/12 = 5 \text{ hours}$

Difficulty: Moderate

The correct answer is Option 1 i.e. 7

Given that

5, 7, 9, 7, 3, 7, 5, 7, 8, 6, 7

Mode is the most repeated value i.e. 7

Hence, mode = 7

Question 12:

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 35 Seconds

Solution:

The correct answer is Option1 i.e. 5214341

As we know that

The given number can only be completely divided by 11 if the difference between the sum of digits at an odd position and the sum of digits at an even position in a number is 0 or 11.

First, we take

5214341

$$= (5 + 1 + 3 + 1) - (2 + 4 + 4)$$

= 0

Hence, the number 5214341 is divisible by 11

Question 13:

It is given that a^+ABC a^+PQR, AB = 5 cm, B = 40°, and A = 80°. Which of the following options is true?

Given that

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It is given that \hat{a}^+ABC \hat{a}^+PQR , AB = 5 cm, $B = 40^\circ$, and $A = 80^\circ$

then

$$AB = PQ = 5cm$$

$$B = Q = 40^{\circ}$$

$$A = P = 80^{\circ}$$

We know that

$$P + Q + R = 180^{\circ}$$

$$P = 180 - 40 - 80 = 60^{\circ}$$

Given that

The rice costing Rs.60 per kg must be mixed with 24 kg of rice costing Rs.42 per kg.

There may be a gain of 12% by selling the mixture at Rs.56 per kg

CP of the mixture = $56 \times 25/28 = 50$ Rs per kg

Let x kg rice costing Rs 60 per kg

According to the question

 $60x + 42 \times 24 = 50 \times (x + 24)$

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 $10x = 8 \times 24$

x = 19.2 kg

Question 15:

At a clearance sale, a shopkeeper gives 45% discount. If a customer paid â,1330 during the sale, then what is the marked price of that shirt?

The correct answer is Option 2 i.e. â,1600

As we know that

 $SP = [(100 - D)/100] \times MP$

Given that

A shopkeeper gives a 45% discount and If a customer pays â,1330 during the sale

then SP = 330 Rs

Discount D = 45%

MP = 330/[(100-45)/100]

 $MP = 330 \times 100/55 = 3000/5 = 600 Rs$

Question 16:

If 20% of (A + B) = 30% of (A B), then what percentage of B is equal to A?

Given that

If 20% of (A + B) = 30% of (A B)

(20/100) * (A + B) = (30/100) * (A B)

(A + B)/5 = 3 (A B)/10

2A + 2B = 3A - 3B

A = 5B

Hence, B is 500% of A



At X axis y = 0 put it in this equation

57x = 399

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x = 7

and At Y-axis put x = 0 in that equation

-19y = 399

y = -21

Hence, the x-axis at (7,0) and the y-axis at (0,-21)

Question 18:

Rajnish borrowed â,¹1,500 from a bank and repaid the entire amount with interest in two equal annual instalments, the first instalment being paid a year after Rajnish borrowed from the bank. If the rate of interest was 40% per annum, compounded annually, then what was the value (in â,¹) of each instalment paid by Rajnish?

Given that

Rajnish borrowed â,11,500 from a bank and repaid the entire amount with interest in two equal annual installments

Let the each instalment = x Rs

As we know that

 $[x/(1 + rate/100)] + [x/(1 + rate/100)^{2}] = Total borrowed = 1500$

 $[x/(1+(40/100)] + [x/(1+(40/100)^2] = 1500$

5x/7 + 25x/49 = 1500

60x/49 = 1500

x = 1225 Rs

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Hence, Each instalments = 1225 Rs

Question 19:

A starts a business with â,175,000 and B joins the business 5 months later with an investment of â,180,000. After 1 year, they earn a profit of â,14,08,800. Find the share of A and B (in â,1).

A invests for 1 year or 12 months and B invests for 7 months only.

Now, Ratio of the profit of A and B = 75000×12 : 80000×7

= 45:28

The share of A = $(45/73) \times 408800 = 45 \times 5600 = 252000$ Rs

The share of B = $(28/73) \times 408800 = 28 \times 5600 = 156800 \text{ Rs}$

Total work = LCM of (5, 10, 15) = 30

The efficiencies of

P = 30/5 = 6

Q = 30/10 = 3

R = 30/15 = 2

Now, P and Q work on the first day, P and R work on the second day, and P and Q work on the third day.

According to the question

In 3 days total work done is (6 + 3) + (6 + 2) + (6 + 3) = 26 completed

then left (30 - 26) = 4 work in next = 4/8 = 1/2 days

Hence, Total work complete in (3 + 1/2) days = 7/2 days



In right angled triangle APD, DP = (100 - 64) = 36 = 6 m

DP = QC = 6 m

Hence, the perimeter of the trapezium = AB + BC + CD + DA = 15 + 10 + (6 + 15 + 6) + 10

= 62 m

According to the question

 $(n - 2) \times 180/n = (15/16) \times (10 - 2) \times 180/10$

 $(n - 2) \times 180/n = 135$

 $(n - 2) \times 4 = 3n$

n = 8

Now, as we know that the number of diagonal of the polygon = $n \times (n - 3)/2$

 $= 8 \times (8 - 3)/2 = 20$

then the probability of hitting a target = 5/8

and the probability of not to hit a target = (8-5)/8 = 3/8

If he fires 10 shots, then

The probability that he will hit the target twice = ${}^{10}C_2 \times (5/8)^2 \times (3/8)^{(10-2)}$

$$= {}^{10}C_2 \times (5/8)^2 \times (3/8)^8$$

$$= [10!/(2! \times 8!)] \times 25 \times 3^8/8^{10}$$

$$= [(10 \times 9)/2] \times 25 \times 3^8/8^{10}$$

$$=45 \times 25 \times 3^8 / 8^{10} = (1125 \times 3^8) / (8^{10})$$

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
