





- 1. Catastrophic: (Adjevtive) Invoviving or **causing sudden great damage or suffering**; extreemely unfortunate or unseccessful turn of events; large scale alteration in state/being.
- 2. Spasmodic: Occuring or done in brief; irregular bursts.
- 3. Catatonic: Characterized or relating to catatonia (catatonia is a condition that results in abnormality in behavior arising due to a disturbed mental state); in an unresponsive or immobile stupor (informal definition).
- 4. Chasm: A deep fissure in the Earth's surface; profound differnce between ideology, practice, poeple, feelings, etc.

The first option expresses the meaning of the given group of words 'causing great damage or suffering' and hence becomes the correct answer to the question.

Question 8:



Solution:

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The correct answer is option 3, i.e. DACB.

- 1. Sentence D provides an introduction to the subject of the passage, which in our case is **minimalist**. The context is also introduced through this first line.
- 2. Sentence A denotes a relation to the first sentence. We can figure that out through the usage of the conjunction 'also'. So, A will appear as the second statement.
- 3. Sentence C uses an adverb 'further' to qualify or add more meaning to the aforementioned subject/meaning/context. In other words, more detail is being added to the passage which makes C suitable in the third place.
- 4. Sentence B ends with a conclusive note. We can vividly understand that through the usage of another adverb **'finally'** which means **'end'** of the overall statement.

This arrangement is the correct answer as the fluency and the sequence of narration is maintained. The grammar is in balance as well, which makes the passage sound correct.

The correct answer is option 3, i.e. always we.

Concept/Grammar rules Application

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In the english language an adverb is a word that add towards or qualifies the meaning of any verb/noun/adjective/preposition in a sentence. It naturally appears after a noun/pronoun and before a verb, keeping aside certain exceptions. Which means an adverb cannot exist on it's own but with/after any of the former mentioned figures of speech.

In the sentence, the starting phrase 'why should' does not indicate the presence of a noun/pronoun until 'we' appears, which is a pronoun. So, the presence of an adverb right before the appearance of the pronoun 'we' in the sentence makes the sentence sound odd. If the adverb follows the pronoun immediately then the sentence seems correct and fluent. for instance, 'why do we always' sounds far better and correct than 'why should always we' because the adverb emphasizes more on the meaning of the noun after which the verb expresses the action of the entire sentence. Placing the adverb abruply only distorts the fluent sense of the statement. This is why it is important to use adverbs after any specific identity or action is established in the sentence. For the other options, there isn't any grammatical error because in the case of option 1 'for her to join' it sounds fluent and correct as the verb follows the noun in a sequential way Page No: 9 If one had to place an

- 4. Decipher: Succeed in understanding, interpreting and identifying something; converting something into normal language or easily understandable terms.

Here option 2 expresses the meaning of the given words perfectly. Hence, it becomes the answer to our question.

Question 11:

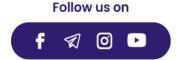

Solution:

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The correct answer is option 1, i.e. My uncle exclaimed that he was unlucky as he had missed the bus again.

- 1. Option 1 follows all the rules of narration from direct to indirect speech. The tense is also correct as the question indicates past tense and this particular option expresses the same. It is also worth noting that the sentence in our question has an **exclamation mark**, which is why the verb '**exclaimed**' appears in the sentence. It is to express the exclamation-mark in the indirect form of narration.
- 2. Option 2 is incorrect as the meaning completely changes. There is an exclamation of disappointment in the question. But option 2 uses the word 'lucky' and this does not reflect the exclamation of disappointment expressed in the question.
- 3. Option 3 is incorrect as the expression of disappointment changes with the usage of the word 'lucky' and the tense also changes from past 'had missed' to present 'to miss'.
- 4. Option 4 is incorrect because there is a grammatical error 'has missed' and the exclamation present in the question is not expressed in the indirect speech.

Question 12:


- 1. Option 1, **bark up the wrong tree** means to mistake one's motif/object, or to pursue the wrong direction to achieve something.
- 2. Option 2, wrap my head around it means to understand something, especially strange or extraordinary; to accomplish something really difficult; to accept something that one would not be willing to accept easily.
- 3. Option 3, cry my eyes out means to cry very hard; crying in an excessive and uncontrolled way.
- 4. Option 4, run out of steam means having no more energy or enthusiasm left to do something.

Option 2 is the correct answer because it expresses the meaning of the context delivered by the question.

Question 13:

Identify the segment in the sentence, which contains the grammatical error. She is a great cook, has her own blog on

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YouTube and was followed by one lakh viewers.

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 83 Seconds

Options:

- 1. She is
- 2. a great cook
- 3. has her own blog
- 4. was followed

Solution:

The correct answer is option 4, i.e. was followed.

- 1. Option 1 does not have any error as it introduces the subject. Also indicates the tense 'is', which is present.
- 2. Option 2 isn't wrong as it establishes the context and uses an adjective to add more meaning to the subject.
- 3. Option 3 isn't wrong because it seconds the meaning, context and tense established by the first segment of the sentence.
- 4. Option 4 is the incorrect part of the sentence because the whole sentence was talking in present tense, whereas ' was followed' implied past tense. Had the whole context been in past tense then this part would have been correct and the sentence would have gone like 'she was a great cook, had her own blog and was followed by one lakh viewers'.

Question 14:

Identify the best way to improve the underlined part of the given sentence. If there is no improvement required, select 'no improvement'. She is a very good sprinter. I can't run as fast as she does.

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 86 Seconds

Options:

- 1. no improvement.
- 2. like she is doing
- 3. as she doing
- 4. as she do

Solution:

The correct answer is option 1, i.e. **no improvement**.

1. Option 1 is correct because nothing in the provided options can make an improvement to what has already been

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given in the question.

- 2. Option 2 is incorrect because the question indicates simple present tense 'as she does' but the option indicates present continuous tense 'like she is doing'. The option changes the meaning of the sentence.
- 3. Option 3 has incorrect grammer. 'As she doing' is missing a word 'is' and hence doesn't end up making complete sense because the time/tense is not properly established in the sentence.
- 4. Option 4 also has incorrect grammar. 'As she do' is missing a 'will' and so it fails to specify the time/tense of the sentence. It therefore does not make complete sense.

Question 15:

Choose the most appropriate option to change the narration (direct / indirect) of the given sentence. Her mother said, "We must have a party to celebrate your promotion."

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 85 Seconds

Options:

- 1. Her mother said that they must have a party to celebrate her promotion.
- 2. Her mother said she had been planning a party for celebrating her promotion.
- 3. Her mother says that they should plan a party to celebrate her promotion.
- 4. Her mother told that they would be having a party to celebrate her promotion.

Solution:

The correct answer is option 1, i.e. Her mother said that they must have a party to celebrate her promotion.

- Option 1 is correct because the sentence follows the basic rules for changing from direct to indirect speech. The
 inverted commas have been ommitted, the tense is correct and the persons have been addressed correctly with
 pronouns such as 'they' and 'her'.
- 2. Option 2 is incorrect because the question indicates a sudden and confirmed decision to have a party. But this particular option/sentence changes that decision into something that wasn't sudden and had been processing since some time, 'had been planning'. This changes the meaning and makes the transition incorrect.
- 3. Option 3 is incorrect because it used 'says' instead of 'said'. This difference brings a change in the tense of the sentence, from past to present.
- 4. Option 4 is incorrect because the tense is changed to future 'they would be having'. If the tense is changed the transition becomes incorrect.

Question 16:

Choose the most appropriate option to change the narration (direct / indirect) of the given sentence. Kiran said, "I will reach Patna tomorrow morning."

Difficulty: Moderate Average Time: 104 Seconds

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Options:

- 1. Kiran said that she will reach Patna tomorrow morning.
- 2. Kiran says that she will reach Patna tomorrow morning.
- 3. Kiran said that I will reach Patna the next morning.
- 4. Kiran said that she would reach Patna the next morning.

Solution:

The correct answer is option 4, i.e. Kiran said that she would reach Patna the next morning.

- 1. Option 1 is incorrect because **'tomorrow morning'** does not sound indirect as the phrase **'the next morning'** does. Placing **'tomorrow'** still has a direct tone in the sentence and hence is not completely accurate even if it makes sense
- 2. Option 2 is incorrect because the sentence uses **'says'** which indicates present tense, whereas the question clearly indicates past tense '**said**'.
- 3. Option 3 is incorrect because of the usage of 'I'. A first person noun is always used in direct speech whereas for indirect speech we use third person like **he**, **she**, **they**, etc.
- 4. Option 4 is the correct answer because the grammar is accurate ('said' as past tense) and there is usage of third person (she) as well. The indirect form of 'tomorrow morning' is also used, 'the next morning' .Hence, these features make the sentence completely accurate.

The sentence is in the active form of simple present tense. The structures for active/passive voices are:

Active: Subject + verb (lst form) + object.

Passive: Object + is/am/are + verb (IIIrd form) + by + subject.

Going by the above rules, the correct option is 4.

As the chosen option follows the given rule it will be correct.

- 4. Option 4 is the correct answer as the tense is correct, the structure of **'subject+verb+object'** is in-tact and there is no grammatical error.
